

Ferro takes Bonnie-Clyde

JEAN, Nev. — Off-road racing veteran Bobby Ferro captured the over-all title in the \$50,000 Bonnie and Clyde 350 Saturday after former Indianapolis 500 winner Parnelli Jones was disqualified.

Ferro, Sherman Oaks, Calif., completed the four laps over the 78-mile desert and mountain course near Las Vegas in seven hours, 12.93 minutes. He won \$5,000 for his victory in Class A for single seat dune buggies.

Jones, running in the double seat class, was forced to retire after three laps. Jones had the fastest time of the day with his modified Bronco but was charged with taking shortcuts on the course.

Winning Class B for two-seat desert racers were Jerry Smith, Oklahoma City, and his co-driver, Don Rhodes, Alcoa, Tenn. All class winners received checks for \$5,000, plus contingency awards.
